## *Features Of The Years' Work*

- ★ Establishment of a Marriage Counselling Section following our approval, in April, 1961, by the Commonwealth Attorney-General's Department as a Marriage Guidance Organisation within the terms of the Matrimonial Causes Act. (Mrs. Deidre Greig has been appointed Marriage Counsellor and Conciliator for the Agency.)
- ★ Increased unemployment in recent months, creating more financial hardship for longer periods for families obliged to exist on statutory benefits, has given rise to many more requests for financial help.
- ★ Migrant families, and individual migrants, have constituted almost one-fifth of our year's case load.
- ★ Specialised service to elderly clients.
- ★ Development in community relations which has led to increasing co-operation and discussion with other organisations concerning special needs in the community.
- ★ Grants and gifts from other organisations and individuals for use in conjunction with case-work.
- ★ Wide variety of service requested; increasing service in consultation capacity.

## *Family and Marriage Counselling*

The counselling service at C.W.S. is based on the firm belief that a stable, happy family life is essential not only to the well-being of the family, but to the community as a whole. Therefore our aim is to help families overcome their difficulties so that they may establish a secure, loving home for themselves and their children.

The problems that people bring to C.W.S. include desertion, mental illness, eviction, debts and rent arrears, truancy, child behaviour problems, marital tension, unemployment and accommodation difficulties. Sometimes information about community services or financial aid is required, but in many instances the family needs constant support and encouragement to face problems which otherwise seem overwhelming. Frequently, those families coming to C.W.S. are so distressed that they are incapable of thinking clearly about the situation and making wise decisions. The social worker's task is to help them face life realistically and so regain confidence in their ability to cope with their problems. The members of the family in this way are drawn more closely together and feel some hope for the future.

Marital counselling has necessarily been an intrinsic part of the work at C.W.S. and recently we were granted "approval" by the Commonwealth Attorney-General, under the new Matrimonial Causes Act, so that this work can be continued effectively. Referrals from soli-



citors, clergy and other organisations will be received to a greater extent than before and Judges also will be able to refer petitioners in divorce suits for conciliation. Many of those people coming for marital counselling need continued support for a long period if they are to have the strength to rebuild their marriage. It is found that desertion, mental illness, financial hardship, cultural barriers and physical violence are often factors which lead people to seek help. Recently a doctor referred a couple who were deeply anxious to maintain their marriage and yet the future seemed hopeless because of the consistent unkindness and cruelty on both sides. Each was given an understanding of the reasons for the conflict, which had been long standing and gradually tension lessened so that their present relationship is now fairly stable. The husband is no longer violent, is showing his wife some attention, and consideration, and she is striving to respond in every way to assist him.

Unemployment has been a dominant feature in much of the work of the past year. Innumerable families have become despairing and near breaking point because of the strain of months of unemployment. Many, on a formerly high income, have to pay for rent, food, clothing and medical expenses from an unemployment benefit of £6/2/6 per week, plus small State allowance for the children. One father of four young children has not been entitled to any Government benefits because he obtains irregular casual work, and it has been necessary for C.W.S. to supplement his income. He could earn no money at all some weeks, and this resulted in rent arrears with threatened eviction. It was necessary to raise £70 to meet rent arrears, to obviate the family being split up permanently and the children made State wards. In this case the parents have struggled very hard to maintain their home, and it would have been tragic if their efforts had failed.

### *Elderly Citizens' Advisory Service*

Discussion with other organisations concerning problems of old age, and special needs arising from them, has been a major feature of the year's work. C.W.S. is particularly appreciative of the opportunities offered in this respect by the Old People's Welfare Council of Victoria whose study groups have held a series of discussions on a variety of subjects including provision for the confused elderly, the coverage of home-help services and the provision of medical and surgical aids and appliances.

Much of our work with elderly clients is necessarily limited by inadequacies in basic community services such as housing, and certain health and domiciliary services. Meeting the individual need continues to present difficulties to the agency as well as being a source of strain and anxiety to the elderly person herself, or to relatives on whom the responsibility falls.

Work with individual elderly people provides much valuable data on needs, and on feelings and attitudes also, which are vital considerations if new services are to be effective.

## *Special Grants and Gifts*

C.W.S. is indebted to a number of organisations and individual citizens who have again made special grants for direct use in casework with clients. In some cases these grants have actually averted family breakdown, e.g., in meeting rent arrears that have occurred through illness, and which would otherwise have led to eviction. Others have provided gifts of clothing for families suffering financial hardship as the result of illness, unemployment and desertion.

For special assistance in individual cases we extend our grateful thanks to the Trustees of the Cato Fund, the Queen's Fund, the Society for Assisting Persons of Education, Jewish Women's Guild, Travellers' Aid Society, Apex and the various Ladies' Benevolent Societies.

We wish to express our deep regret of the death of Miss Mabel C. Trumble, Secretary of the Queen's Fund. Miss Trumble's valued help and personal friendship is a sad loss to us all.

## *Community Relations*

Membership of committees studying special problems and needs has continued to be an important part of our work.

Notable amongst these committees is that set up at the request of the Chief Secretary, and headed by Mr. Whatmore, Director-General, Social Welfare Department, to study the question of immediate emergency relief to families in financial need through unemployment and sickness. Mrs. Alison Mathew is a member of this committee.

C.W.S. has been represented on a number of sub-committees established by the Victorian Council of Social Service, while staff members have attended meetings of many other organisations and have been called on to address numerous groups.

Series of discussions with staff members of other family service agencies on specific problems have proved particularly stimulating.

## *Student Training*

During the past year six students from the University Department of Social Studies have undertaken field work in the agency, as part of their curriculum. The students, assigned to individual staff members, have had opportunities to gain first-hand knowledge of a wide variety of social problems, and to work directly with the people concerned under the supervision of experienced social workers.



## *Hearing Aid Service*

Unique in Australia, our hearing aid service designed to provide aids free of cost to age and invalid pensioners and people in humble circumstances, was instrumental in providing 75 of these appliances throughout the year. The list of applicants far exceeds the number of aids available for re-conditioning, and it is hoped to overcome this problem by an all-out drive for donations of aids through press and radio publicity campaigns.

Our thanks are again due to the following for their co-operation in the scheme:—

- (1) Donors of hearing aids no longer required.
- (2) Hearing aid firms who make available experts for testing, fitting, and re-conditioning of donated aids.
- (3) Audigene Acoustics for the preparation of ear moulds.
- (4) Eveready Company for the donation of batteries required for initial installation.

## *Public Appeal*

Under the able leadership of the Appeal Chairman, Sir Samuel Wadham, and backed whole-heartedly by the Executive Organising and Citizens' Committees, "Project Good Samaritan" was launched in July.

We were honoured by Sir John Latham's patronage of "Project Good Samaritan" which led to the further honour bestowed on C.W.S. by Sir John when he agreed to become the first Patron of our service.

We are indebted to the many business houses, charitable trusts, private citizens, clubs, staff welfare funds and other groups who gave generously in support of the appeal.

Publicity, freely given by the "Herald", "Age", "Sun", suburban newspapers, radio stations and television channels did much to encourage support and helped greatly in educating the community in the voluntary social welfare work performed by C.W.S.

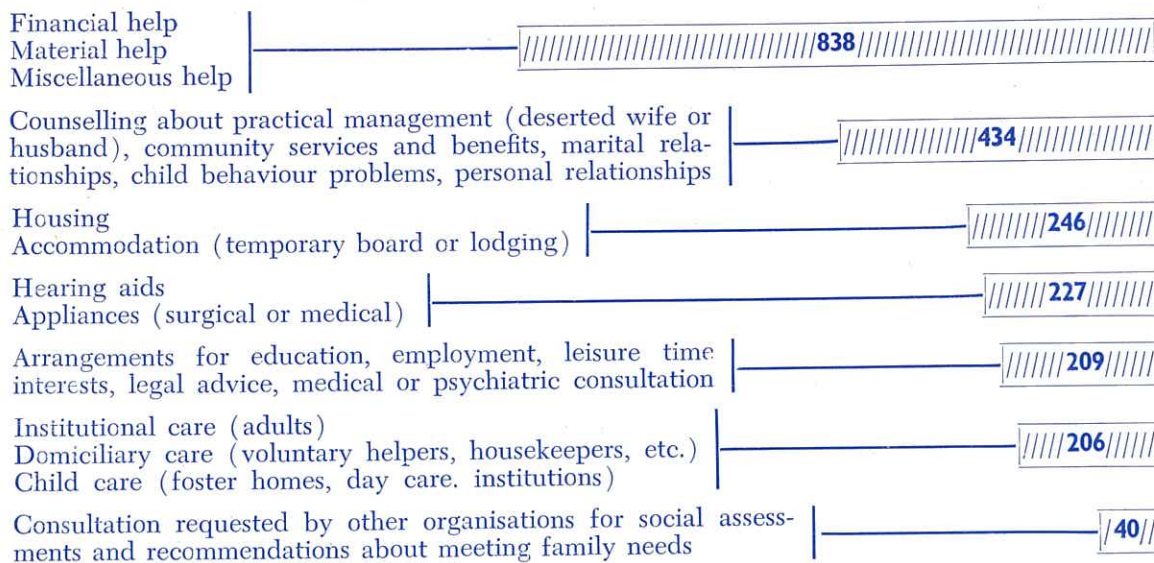

# Statistical Analysis Services Requested

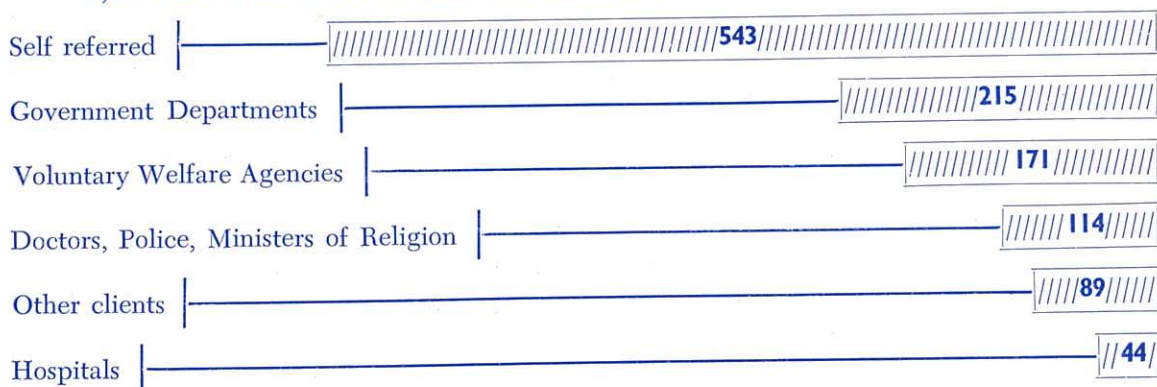
2,193 services were requested and came within the following categories:—



The number of services requested exceeds the number of cases registered as each family usually presents several problems and thus requires several services. For instance, a family homeless through eviction, desertion, demolition of house, termination of lease, etc., will often need temporary accommodation pending housing, furniture to equip the house or rooms when found, and financial help for removal. The family with a mentally-ill parent will often need arrangements for psychiatric consultation and hospitalisation, care of children, housekeeper service, advice about Government benefits, financial help pending these, combined with continuous personal counselling.

## Sources of Referral

1,176 cases were dealt with and were referred to C.W.S. from the following sources:—



Of the 1,176 cases in the table, 782 were new, while the balance, viz., 394, were cases which had been registered in an earlier financial year.

Each case represents a whole family, except for a few elderly clients who are single or widowed.



## *Work With Migrants*

Two hundred and four migrants came to C.W.S. for help with problems and hardship arising from unemployment, illness and difficulties in adjustment to their new country. Their problems were intensified by language difficulties, cultural differences and isolation from relatives whose support they need. Casework with migrant families presents a special challenge to the family service agency which needs specialised legal and other consultation services to advise on cultural differences.

## *Staff*

Mr. Leonard Tierney, who had been granted 12 months' leave of absence in January, 1960, resigned the position of Director of Social Work and Research to take a post with the University of Melbourne which afforded him the opportunity to research intensively into social welfare problems. Mr. Tierney's leadership was an inspiration and example to the social work staff and was the means of developing a casework service of the highest standard. His acceptance of membership of the Executive Committee has proved a great asset in the management of the agency.

It was with much regret that the resignation of Mrs. Alison Mathew, Acting Director of Social Work, was accepted. Mrs. Mathew has taken a position with the Kildonan Home's Committee of the Presbyterian Church, and, although she will be greatly missed as a member of the staff, her agreement to join the Executive Committee will ensure C.W.S. of retaining her most valuable services.

Miss Shirley Ramsay was appointed Acting Director of Social Work and has capably guided the social work of C.W.S.

Miss Helen Arnel was welcomed to the staff of social workers.

The loss of services brought about by the resignation of Miss F. A. Hitchcock and Mrs. I. Humffray is regretted.

Mrs. M. Beggs and Mrs. M. McLeod were welcomed to the administrative staff.

A most pleasing success came our way this year through the acceptance by Sir John Latham, G.C.M.G., of our invitation to become the first Patron of C.W.S.
